The mission of the Nebraska Association for Infant Mental Health is to promote and support nurturing relationships for all infants that provide the essential formative context in which every infant acquires basic emotional, cognitive, physical and social capacities and attitudes which, in turn influence all later development. To achieve this purpose, the Association engages in the following activities:

- (a) Provide an interdisciplinary infant mental health organization that facilitates, supports and encourages cooperation, coordination and collaboration among those concerned with promoting the optimal development of infants and families;
- (b) Provide a forum for interaction and study among mental health, public health, education, social services professionals, families, and others regarding scientific, educational, and clinical relationship-based work with infants and their caregivers;
- (c) Advocate for infant mental health services and supports to infants and young children and their families; and
- (d) Publish and distribute educational newsletters, journals, and other materials which promote an increased understanding of infant mental health issues or which are otherwise consistent with the purposes of the Association.
